




Has your professor recommended you a book and you want to read it?

You should find out:

- book's title
- the author
- the edition
- where it is available









Basic action in bibliographic research:

- Identify a topic
 - What's your goal? Report, Paper, Thesis...
 - Are you able to use the proper sources?
 Not every topic can be supported by adequate (and linguistically approachable) bibliography.
- Plan your writing process
 - Presentation, analysis, scientific debate
 - Introduction, analysis of the primary sources and secondary ones, debate, metodology used, conclusions, bibliography, annexes...







Using Boolean operators....


And + Between concepts to narrow your search

How? Searching by topics, key-words, author, etc. on:

Bibliographies
 List of documents dealing with a specific topic or produced by a specific author



Catalogues and other instruments

To locate bibliographic informations (GalileoDiscovery)

Bibliographic databases

Systematic collections of bibliography and abstracts of journal, report or newspaper articles listed in it. Full-text is often available.

Web

Scholarly search engines (<u>Google scholar</u>, <u>Google books</u>), institutional web sites (<u>Istat</u>, <u>Onu</u>, ecc) and archives (<u>Padua@Thesis</u>, <u>Padua@Research</u>)








Where?







CRAAP TEST

Currency

Information can quickly become obsolete. Is your topic in an area that changes rapidly? When was the information published or last updated? Are links or references to other sources up to date?

Relevance

Does the information answer your research question? Does the information meet the stated requirements of the assignment? Is the information too technical or too simplified for you to use? Does the source add something new to your knowledge of your topic?

Authority

What are the author's credentials? Is the author affiliated with an educational institution or prominent organization? Can you find information about the author from reference books or the Internet? Do other books or articles cite the author?

Accuracy

Are there statements you know to be false? Are there errors in spelling, punctuation, or grammar? Was the information reviewed by editors or subject experts before it was published? What citations or references support the author's claims? What do other people have to say about the topic?

Purpose

Why did the author or publisher make this information available? Is there an obvious bias or prejudice? Are alternative points of view presented? Does the author omit important facts or data that might disprove a claim? Does the author use strong or emotional language?






Why to cite?

Citations

- state every source you use
- give scientific credit to your work

Plagiarism

i.e. "the practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own (Oxford Dictionaries 2014)

It means to steel words, ideas, creative works, and it's:

- illegal, because of the copyright law (L.633/1944 and other rev.);
- reprehensible, because it runs against intellectual honesty – the basic rule of our University.

Citation styles

Every citation style establishes rules about:

- Details
 - like author, title, publication date, retrieval date, etc.
- Key frame and format
 - Series of details (according to the type of material!)
 - Punctuation, fonts, space.








How to write a dissertation




